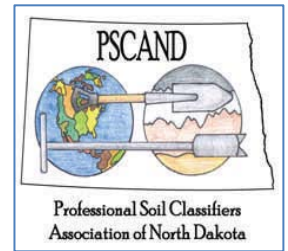

The North Dakota Chapter of the Soil and Water Conservation Society, in association with the Professional Soil Classifiers Association of North Dakota is holding a Soil and Water Summit June 10-11, 2014. The focus of this Summit is to present and discuss the impacts to soils and waters of North Dakota as a result of spills and releases of crude oil, crude oil emulsion, and production salt-water along with the responses made by the oil industry, regulators, and consultants. With recent public awareness of these issues, the goal of this Summit is to provide a *science-based* agenda to further educate the attendees on what is happening in the North Dakota Oil Patch.

The first day of the conference, June 10, 2014, will have presentations by soil scientists, oil industry representatives, regulatory officials, and consultants. The second day, June 11, 2014, includes a bus tour of reclaimed sites. These locations will focus on past impacted areas, and the reclamation work that has been completed.
